



GREATER SOUTHWEST MUSIC FESTIVAL RULES & REGULATIONS

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GENERAL INFORMATION AND REGISTRATION:

- The Greater Southwest Music Festival is open to all elementary, middle school, junior high, & high school students (*public, private, charter, homeschool, etc.*). Students aged pre-school through high school may participate in the Solo & Ensemble competition.
- All entries must be submitted by school director or studio teacher on the Amarillo Symphony's Festival site.
- Requests for specific performance times will be given every consideration.
- Organization and Solo & Ensemble participants may enter for "COMMENTS ONLY". Directors should indicate this choice at check-in.

Amarillo Civic Center (3rd & Buchanan):

Auditorium: MS & HS Varsity Bands, Orchestras; Full Orchestras; Special Bands & Orchestras (*unaffiliated with a school*)

Grand Plaza: MS & HS Non-Varsity Bands, Orchestras; Beginning Bands, Orchestras

Hospitality Room: Show Choirs; Jazz Bands

Globe-News Center for the Performing Arts (500 S Buchanan St., 79101): Concert Choirs; Vocal Solo & Ensemble

Amarillo College (Washington St. Campus): Instrumental Solo & Ensemble (*Strings, WW/B/P, and Piano*)

- IMPORTANT**: All fees must be paid by Wednesday, April 13, 2022. Please communicate with Amarillo Symphony staff if a PO is required for invoicing.

CLASSIFICATION: Classification shall be based on school enrollment as of Monday, January 6, 2020. Directors must show correct Festival classification during registration. Signature of principal or superintendent will verify the eligibility of students and correct classification. Single entries in any performance division may result in re-assignment.

IMPORTANT: Duplication of personnel between varsity & non-varsity bands/choirs/orchestras is not permitted.

CLASSES: Groups must provide 'Class Identification' to determine pricing and venue:

- Elementary_____Elementary Groups
- Varsity_____Varsity Groups only
- Non-Varsity_____Non-Varsity Groups only
- Private_____Private Schools, Groups, or Studios

CONCERT BAND, ORCHESTRA, and JAZZ BAND REGULATIONS:

A. There is no prescribed list of selections.

- It is suggested **concert bands** perform a march and one (1) or two (2) other works suitable for contest use.
- **Orchestras** are encouraged to perform at least two (2) selections suitable for contest use.
- **Jazz bands** are asked to perform three (3) tunes of contrasting styles suitable for competition.

B. Published Scores –

- **Concert bands & orchestras** must provide three (3) published scores with measures numbered for each composition performed. Any duplicated scores must be accompanied by a letter from the publisher.
- **Jazz bands** are only required to provide one (1) published score with measures numbered for each composition performed.

C. Times begin with setup and end with vacant stage.

IMPORTANT: *Larger ensembles needing extra setup time will be required to register for two (2) 20-minute time slots.*

D. Stage Equipment Furnished (for Auditorium & Grand Plaza performances ONLY) –

IMPORTANT: *Jazz bands need to furnish all electronic equipment, including extension cords.*

E. Warm-Up Facilities –

- **Concert Bands & Orchestras** will be provided warm-up time/facility prior to performance for a period not to exceed time allotted on stage (*20-minutes*).
- **Jazz bands** will have a 40-minute performance time and includes time for warm-up.

CONCERT CHOIR REGULATIONS:

A. There is no prescribed list of selections. Each choir will sing three (3) selections, including at least one unaccompanied selection.

B. Concert choirs must provide three (3) published scores with measures numbered for each composition performed. Any duplicated scores must be accompanied by a letter from the publisher.

C. Times begin with setup and end with vacant stage.

D. Stage Equipment Furnished –

- standard acoustic piano
- choral risers

IMPORTANT: *The performing group should furnish any additional equipment.*

E. Warm-up facilities will be provided prior to performance for a period not to exceed time allotted on stage (*~20-minutes*).

SHOW CHOIR REGULATIONS:

A. There is no prescribed list of selections. Each organization is asked to perform three (3) selections of contrasting styles suitable for contest use.

B. Show choirs are only required to provide one (1) published score with measures numbered for each composition performed. Any duplicated scores must be accompanied by a letter from the publisher.

C. Performance time is not to exceed 40 minutes, including set-up and strike.

D. Equipment Furnished –

- standard acoustic piano

IMPORTANT: *No electric equipment is furnished.*

E. Warm-up facilities will be provided for a period not to exceed time allotted during performance (*~30-minutes*).

SOLO & ENSEMBLE CONTEST REGULATIONS (Piano, Woodwinds, Brass, Percussion, Strings, and Vocal):

A. There is no prescribed list of selections for Solo & Ensemble contest. Please choose contest-type materials.

- **Vocal & piano solos** MUST be memorized to earn an 'Outstanding.'
- **Instrumental solos (excluding piano)** do NOT need to be memorized to earn an 'Outstanding.'
- Piano ensembles (2-4 people) need not be memorized.

B. Participants are required to provide one (1) published score with measures numbered. Any duplicated scores must be accompanied by a letter from the publisher.

C. **EQUIPMENT FURNISHED –**

- pianos for ‘piano solo & ensemble’ and for accompaniment purposes (*solos & ensembles*)
- percussion equipment (*at Amarillo College*)

IMPORTANT: Recorded accompaniments may be used; performers **MUST** furnish their own playback equipment.

D. **Performance Time Limits –**

- **Instrumental Solo & Ensemble** (*Piano, Woodwinds, Brass, Percussion, Strings*): 5-minute slot (*includes tuning, performance, exit*). Per the discretion of the judge, performances exceeding five (5) minutes may/may not be played in its entirety. Students should check-in with their monitor fifteen minutes before performance.
- **Vocal Solo & Ensemble:** 5-minute slot (*includes introductions, performance, exit*). Students should check-in with their monitor fifteen minutes before performance.
- **5-minute time limits are for a single performance of a single work (solo OR ensemble); only one (1) piece per 5-minute slot.** Students (*solo OR ensemble*) performing more than one (1) piece will need to complete multiple entry forms.

E. **Students must play for assigned judge in order to receive rating.** Exceptions may be made by contest site chairman only.

F. **Small Ensembles –**

- Duets, Trios, Quartets, Quintets, etc.

IMPORTANT: Piano ensembles are limited to 2–4 students.

G. **Medium Ensembles –**

- **Woodwinds/Brass/Percussion:** 11–24 students (*no more than 2 on a part*)
- **Strings:** 11–24 students (*no more than 4 on a part*)
- **Vocal:** 11–24 students (*no more than 8 on a part*)

H. **Adequate sponsors/chaperones for students MUST be present at Solo & Ensemble sites.**

I. In case of accompanist conflicts, consult with contest site chairman at the contest site office for adjustments.

RATING SYSTEM & CONCERT BAND/CHOIR/ORCHESTRA AWARDS:

- Each adjudicator will assign a rating in accordance to the following: 0 (Outstanding), 1 (1st Division), 2 (2nd Division), or 3 (3rd Division). Composite ratings shall result in a single rating for each performing group (ex: 1, 2, 2 = 2). Performance groups receiving an ‘Outstanding’ or ‘1st Division’ will be eligible for the ‘Best in Class’ awards.
- Either an ‘Outstanding’ or ‘1st Division’ trophy will be awarded to those organizations receiving a corresponding rating in each class of competition. Trophies are awarded to the highest-ranking groups as determined by the adjudicators.
- IMPORTANT:** ‘Best in Class’ awards will be announced and presented in a ceremony immediately following the competition in the Grand Plaza on the evening of Saturday, April 30, 2022.

SOLO & ENSEMBLE AWARDS:

- Each adjudicator will assign a rating in accordance to the following: 0 (Outstanding), 1 (1st Division), 2 (2nd Division), or 3 (3rd Division). Composite ratings shall result in a single rating for each performing group (ex: 1, 2, 2 = 2).

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
